ORDINANCE / REGULATIONS FOR

LL.M. (One Year Programme)

Faculty of Law, Integral University, Lucknow

2019-2020

The University will run the LL.M. (One Year Programme) i.e master's degree in law under the Centre for Post Graduate Legal Studies (hereinafter "*CPGLS*") under the Faculty of Law.

1. Admission:

1.1. Admission in LL.M. (One Year Programme) as mentioned in Annexure - I will be carried out as per the rules prescribed from time to time by the Academic Council of the Integral University (here-in after called University).

1.2 . Once admitted, there shall be no provision to transfer of student to any other programme

2. Eligibility

2.1. Eligibility details for admission to various courses of study are given in Annexure – 2.

2.2. The Academic Council shall have the power to amend or repeal the eligibility criteria laid down at clause 2.1, if required.

3. Duration:

3.1. LL.M. (One Year Programme) will be of one year comprising of two semesters. Each semester shall have normally 90 working days, or as prescribed by the University from time to time.

3.2. The maximum time allowed for completing the Master of Laws programme shall be two years.

3.3. The candidate failing to complete the course within the maximum time prescribed in (clause 3.2) shall be liable for cancellation of their admission. In such a case the candidate shall have no financial claim on the University.

4. Registration:

Each student has to register in every semester of the programme.

5. Curriculum & Credit System:

5.1 The One Year Curriculum has been divided into two Semesters and shall include Lectures, Tutorials, Seminars and Dissertation as defined in the scheme of instructions and examinations and executive instructions issued by the University from time to time.

5.2 Minimum Credit Requirements:

The minimum credit required for award of LL.M. One Year Programme is 27. This is normally divided into Theory Subjects, Seminars and Dissertation in duration of Two Semesters. The credits are distributed Semester wise as given in the Evaluation Scheme. Subjects generally progress in sequences, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the students. Students are expected to follow the semester wise schedule of subjects given in the Evaluation Scheme of the Programme.

5.3. Subject Categories:

The Curriculum will contain subjects in the following categories having credits in the ranges given below in such a way that the total of all credits will be equal to that required for the award of degree. The categories of subjects are:-

5.4 Programme Structure:

The one-year LL.M. Degree Programme requires the student to complete their Departmental Core, Departmental Electives, and Dissertation for the award of LL. M. Degree.

5.4 (i) The Programme Consist of four Departmental Core (DC)

5.4 (ii) **Departmental Electives;** The students will be taught two Departmental Electives (DE's) in the first semester and four Departmental Electives (DE's) in the second semester in their respective specialization. The student has to choose two Departmental Electives from the cluster of three Departmental Electives (DE's) in the first semester and four Departmental Electives (DEs) from the cluster of six Departmental Electives (DE's) in the Second Semester.

5.5 Approval of the Curriculum:

The Curriculum for LL.M. One Year will be prepared by the department concerned and will be approved by the Board of Studies of the department. It will then be placed in the Faculty Board for Approval. Once approved by the Faculty Board, it will be placed in the Academic Council for final approval and then the Curriculum will be implemented. The same procedure shall be used for any modification in the Curriculum.

6. Examination / Assessment and Grading

6.1 Components of Evaluation: Each subject will be evaluated out of 100 marks. The subjects will normally have two components of the evaluation.

- i. Continuous Assessment (CA): 60 marks
- ii. End-Semester Examination (ESE): 40 marks

6.2 Heads of Passing: Continuous Assessment (CA) and End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be two separate heads for passing a subject.

6.3. Promotion of Student and Award of Grades

A student will be declared PASS if,

- He/she secures at least 45% marks in CA & 35% marks in ESE.

OR

- If He/she fails in Continuous Assessment but secures 50% or more in the total (Continuous Assessment + End Semester Examination) in that subject he/she will be declared as PASS.

6.4. Carry Forward of Marks: In case of a student who does not fulfill criteria mentioned in section 6.3 and fails in the Continuous Assessment and/or End Semester Examination in one or more subjects.

- A Student who PASSES in the continuous Assessment but FAILS in the End Semester Examination of the subject shall reappear for the End Semester Examination of that subject. However his/her marks of the Continuous Assessment shall be carried over and he / she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.
- A Student who PASSES in the End Semester Examination but FAILS in the Continuous Assessment of the subject shall reappear for the Continuous Assessment of that subject. However his/her marks of the End Semester Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing. If he / she fails in Continuous Assessment

but secures 50% or more in the total (Continuous Assessment + End Semester Examination) in that subject he / she will be declared as PASS.

6.5.Re-examination of Continuous Assessment and End Semester Examination:-

6.5.(I). Re-examination for Continuous Assessment should be completed before the commencement of Next Semester Theory Examination.

Example: A Student who is supposed to reappear for Internal Assessment in the Semester-I subject will appear for the Re-examination before the commencement of the End Semester Examination of Semester II. Re-examination of Continuous Assessment will be based on a single examination having the same marks as the original assessment. A Student who is supposed to reappear can be in the form of a subject project/assignment problem/test etc. A Student will do the submission of the assigned work in the predefined period. Records should be maintained properly for all the re-examinations as well as Continuous Assessments.

6.5 (II). Re-examination if the End Semester Examination will be conducted as per the schedule planned by the University.

6.6 Allowed to Keep Term (ATKT): For promotion from the current semester to the subsequent semester a student should not fail in more than the following heads: Note: Grade AB (Absent) should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding ATKT.

6.7 Grading of Performance

6.7.1 Letter Grade and Grade Point Allocation: In LL.B. Programme based on the combined performance in all Assessments in a particular Semester as per the Curriculum/Syllabus the Student is awarded a letter grade. These letter grades not only indicate a qualitative Assessment of the learner’s performance but also carry a quantitative (numeric) equivalent called the Grade Point. The Letter Grades and their Equivalent Grade Point.

For a learner who remains absent in any form of evaluation/examination, the letter grade allocated to him/her should be AB and the corresponding grade point is zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course. The subjects will be adopted from other programs their grade will be decided as per the ordinance of the respective program.

6.8 Re-admission to the University:

A Student who fails will have to repeat the year as a regular student. He / She will be allowed for re-admission on payment of prescribed fees provided he/she satisfies one of the following conditions:

6.8.1 A student is declared failed.

6.8.2 A student did not appear in the semester examination and/or he/she was granted permission not to appear in the examination on his/her own request.

6.8.3 A student has been detained by the University and has also been permitted to take re-admission.

7. Result

7.1 If a student passes all the examinations and fulfils all the requirements for the award of a degree his/her result will be shown as “Passed” mentioning the letter grade obtained by the student.

7.2 Rank / Positions will be determined at the end of the even semester. Only those students who fulfill the following conditions will be eligible for ranks/positions:

D). They do not have any breaks in their studies;

- II). They have passed every scheduled subject in the first attempt;
- III). They have passed every subject on time as per the curriculum;
- IV). They have earned credits as per the schedule given in the curriculum;
- V). They have not improved grades in any subject after passing the subject.

The students who violate any of the above conditions will not be awarded any rank/position. The ranks/positions will be determined on the basis of the Cumulative Grade Performance Index (CGPI)

8. Grace Marks

8.1 A student may be awarded grace marks up to a maximum of total 10 marks, in a maximum of 3 subjects including theory papers, and/or aggregate marks in each academic year provided he/she can be declared to have passed the academic year by the award of these marks.

8.2 The grace marks shall not be added to the aggregate marks.

9. Scrutiny

9.1 Scrutiny shall be allowed in all the papers as per the rules of the University.

9.2 Re-evaluation is not permitted.

10. Award of Degree

On having successfully completed the program, the student shall be awarded LL.M. (One Year Programme).

11. Cancellation of Admission

The admission of student at any stage of study shall be cancelled if:

11.1 He / She is not found qualified as per state government norms and guidelines or the eligibility criteria prescribed by the University.

or

11.2 He / She is found unable to complete the subject within the stipulated time as prescribed in clause 3.2.

or

11.3 He / She is found involved in creating indiscipline in the University.

or

11.4 He / She is found involved in any criminal case / has given any false statement.

- Minimum Percentage for Admission
 - a) General Category - 50% in LL.B and S.C., S.T., OBC and P.H. – 45% in LL.B.
