The Legal Aid Society, Faculty of Law, Integral University was established to promote the objectives of Article 39A of the Constitution of India, that the State shall ensure that the operation of the legal system promoting justice, on the basis of equal opportunity, and, in particular, provide free legal aid, by suitable legislation or schemes or in any other way, to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities. In lieu of application of Article 39A Free legal aid is the provision of free legal services in civil and criminal matters for those poor and marginalized people who cannot afford the services of a lawyer for the conduct of a case or a legal proceeding in any Court, Tribunal or Authority. These services are governed by the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 and headed by the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA). The Legal Aid Society aims to spread awareness about the rights and duties provided under the Constitution of India and the essential laws enacted to uplift and improve the social inclusion of the downtrodden and vulnerable communities. In lieu of this the Legal Aid Society, Faculty of Law, Integral University in collaboration with Integral University Social Service (IUSS) organized a **"Free Legal Aid Camp"** at **Village Muttaquipur, IIM Road, Lucknow-226013**, on **21st September 2023**. The primary components of the event were a

Free Legal Aid Camp: This aspect of the event involved providing free legal assistance and guidance to individuals who needed help with legal matters. Legal experts, lawyers & law students from Integral University's Department of Law have volunteered their services to offer advice, answer legal questions, and possibly assist with legal paperwork.

Nukkad Natak: In this context, students performed a street play that revolved around the issue of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens. These plays are typically engaging and interactive, making them an effective medium to raise awareness and educate the public about the laws existing with regard to the volatile issues.

This Event was presided by two eminent Advocates of Lucknow Bench, High Court, **Adv. Mohd Sufiyan Khan** and **Adv. Aaqib Haider**.

Under the guidance of these eminent practitioners, the people of the village were provided with sufficient legal assistance on various questions raised by the legal experts. Law students of the Department also accompanied for the successful conduct of the event, under the theme **"Nyaya Chala ke Dwar"**. Overall, this event has been a multifaceted effort to provide legal aid to those in need while also using a creative and interactive approach to address social issues through street theatre.
