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**Report on National Current Good Manufacturing Practice (cGMP) Day, on October 10, 2023 organized by Faculty of Pharmacy**

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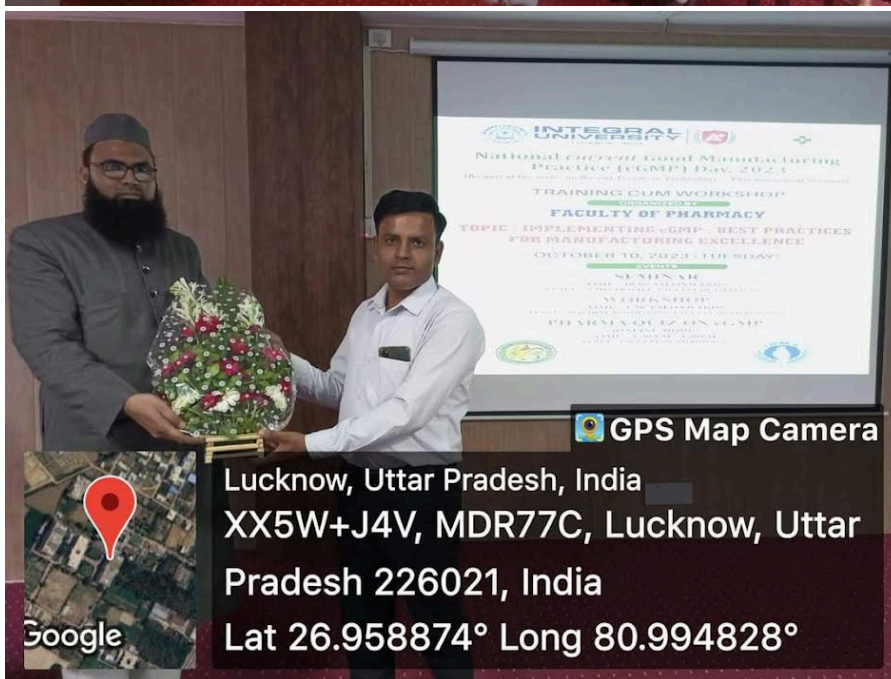
**Brief Report****On****Current Good Manufacturing Practice (cGMP) Day**
