"Exploring Innovative Teaching Learning Resources for Quality Teaching across Disciplines" 25th to 26th, April 2024

Inaugural session

The workshop session was commenced by the welcome address of Prof.(Dr). A.K. Lodi, Head of Department of Education in which he expressed his gratitude towards the Chancellor Prof. S.W. Akhtar, Vice-Chancellor Prof. Javed Musarrat, Pro-Chancellor Dr. Syed Nadeem Akhtar provided an opportunity to conduct a two days' workshop on Exploring Innovative Teaching Learning Resources for Quality Teaching across Disciplines in collaboration with IIAHSR, He also welcomed all the participants from diverse disciplines. The anchors Ms. Guncha Khan & Ms, Apekshita Solomon introduced the guest, Dr. Ritu Tripathi Chakravarty, Associate Professor and the head of the Happiness Centre at Amity University, Lucknow. The topic of her session was "Insight towards Innovations in Teaching Learning Materials" Commencing with the screening of Steve Lutz's film titled "Happiness," Dr. Chakravarty established a foundational narrative centered around the pursuit and varied manifestations of happiness. In conclusion, she advocated for prioritizing the creation of joyful learning environments conducive to student-centered experiences.

Session: 2

The second session of the day was led by Dr. Kiran Dayal, a Lecturer at Hindi Montfort Inter College, Lucknow. Dr. Dayal's lecture focused on the topic of "Quality enhancement of language teaching through storytelling and Kavita Path-Theory & Practice" She initiated the discourse by delving into strategies for incorporating the mother tongue, Hindi, into classroom instruction to enhance student engagement, suggesting methods such as storytelling and poetry. Dr. Dayal highlighted the rationale behind teaching language skills in schools, emphasizing the transition from oral proficiency to written language and the nuances of grammar and tone. She contrasted traditional teacher-centered approaches with contemporary student-centered methodologies, stressing the importance of selecting instructional platforms conducive to innovative learning. Exploring the essence of Hindi, Dr. Dayal elucidated its script, Devanagari, and its intrinsic relationship between spoken and written forms. Concluding her lecture, she underscored the significance of experiential learning over rote instruction, advocating for practical application of language skills.

Session: 3

Dr. Asha Solomon led the third session of the day, focusing on the theme of "How to create vibrancy in teaching English". As an English lecturer at M. I. College, Lucknow, Dr. Solomon drew a comparison between the English language learning levels in Indian and American schools. While acknowledging the structured approach in India that enhances language proficiency, she cautioned against the associated stress and advocated for a more enjoyable learning process. Dr. Solomon introduced three pivotal concepts: smart pedagogy, emphasizing the art of teaching; the significance of English as a second language, fostering global citizenship; and the importance of understanding students to tailor teaching methods accordingly. She elaborated on techniques to engage students actively and promote respect in the classroom, leading to improved learning outcomes and teacher satisfaction. Highlighting the outcomes of teaching English as a second language, she emphasized cultural awareness, confidence in communication, critical thinking, vocabulary expansion, lifelong learning, creativity, adaptability, interpersonal skills, and acceptance of diverse perspectives. Concluding with a quote from the Bible, she stressed the importance of introspection and spiritual alignment for wisdom and advocated for inclusivity and a collective effort towards nurturing future leaders.

Session: 4

The workshop resumed after break with the fourth session of the day in which Anchors Ms. Guncha Khan & Apekshita Solomon gave a brief description of the resource person Dr. Veena Purvaar, Director of Versatile Scholar School in Lucknow. She delved into the topic "Developing Teaching Learning Materials for Innovative teaching in Social Studies" in an engaging manner, initiating the session with interactive activities. Participants were given hands-on experiences through various exercises, promoting logical reasoning and creativity as they crafted teaching aids. Dr. Purvaar emphasized the importance of employing teaching methods that foster student engagement, highlighting the student-centric nature of the learning process. Throughout the, attendees were encouraged to actively participate in the activities curetted by Dr. Purvaar, aimed at promoting experiential learning. She underscored that involving students in the learning process enhances understanding, advocating for a classroom environment where students are at the core of the educational

experience. As she concluded her lecture, Dr. Purvaar facilitated a question-and-answer session, prompting participants to share innovative activities to invigorate classroom dynamics.

The resource persons of the day were presented mementos by Prof. (Dr.) A.K. Lodi, Head, Department of Education and Prof. (Dr.) Ashfaque Khan, Director, IIAHSR. The day concluded by Vote of thanks by Ms. Zarren Firdaus, Asst. Prof. IIAHSR, in which expressed thanks to the dignitaries on the dais and all the resource persons of the day.

Day-2 (26th April, 2024)

Dr. R. K. Mitra, a Physics lecturer at Montfort Inter College, Lucknow, a vibrant scholar and the nominee for Padma Shree having vast experience of 37 years conducted the subsequent session Titled "How to Innovate Physical Science Teaching For students", emphasizing engaging experiments and the importance of TLM. He carried with him a small laboratory through which he demonstrated how basic topics like force, Newton's Laws, Rectilinear motion, vectors, can be taught using activities. He presented innovative ways which students can devise to prepare teaching learning resources which can play an important role in clearing concepts and making learning of science interesting.
