The Department of Environmental Science, under the aegis of Eco-Sync, organized an awareness and sensitization program on the occasion of National Girl Child Day 2026 on 24th January 2026 in BNLT Block at 12:00pm. The program was conducted with the objective of creating awareness about the importance of the girl child in society and sensitizing students towards issues of gender equality, education, health, and empowerment. National Girl Child Day is observed to highlight the challenges faced by girls and to promote equal opportunities and rights for them, and the program aligned itself with these broader social goals. The program aligns with the **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals**, particularly **SDG 5 (Gender Equality)** by promoting awareness on empowerment and equal opportunities for the girl child. It also contributes to **SDG 4 (Quality Education)** through sensitization and awareness-building, and **SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities)** by encouraging inclusive and equitable social attitudes.

The program featured sensitization sessions delivered by faculty members of the Department of Environmental Science. **Dr. Syed Saema** in her insightful session talked on gender equality and women empowerment. She sensitized the participants to the various social, educational, and cultural challenges faced by the girl child. Her address encouraged students to adopt gender-sensitive attitudes and to actively contribute towards eliminating discrimination and promoting equality in everyday life.
