



**Brief Report on Animal Health Camp organized by Department of Agriculture, IIAST,
Integral University Lucknow in Dasauli Village on 18th April 2026**

Animal health care camps play a vital role in improving livestock productivity and strengthening the socio-economic condition of rural communities. These camps provide essential veterinary services such as disease diagnosis, treatment, deworming, and advisory support, which help in reducing mortality and enhancing the overall health status of animals. They also create awareness among farmers regarding scientific livestock management practices including nutrition, hygiene, and disease prevention. In this regard, an Animal Health Camp was successfully organized at Dasauli Village, Lucknow by the Department of Agriculture, IIAST, Integral University on 18th April 2026.

The camp was organized with the objective of providing basic veterinary health services to livestock in the nearby area and spreading awareness among farmers about improved animal husbandry practices. A total of 15 livestock farmers actively participated in the programme and brought their animals for examination and treatment. The services provided during the camp included general health check-ups, deworming, and treatment of sick animals. Farmers were also provided with practical advice on balanced feeding, proper housing, clean milk production, and preventive health care measures to improve productivity and reduce disease occurrence.

The camp also served as a field-based learning opportunity for students. A total of 16 students of 4th year B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture actively participated in the programme and assisted in animal handling, clinical examination, and farmer interaction. This hands-on exposure helped students gain practical knowledge of livestock health management and extension activities. The participating farmers showed keen interest in adopting improved feeding practices and disease control measures, highlighting the importance of such outreach programmes.

The program was organized under the leadership of Prof. Mohd. Haris Siddiqui, Director, Department of Agriculture, IIAST and Prof. Saba Siddiqui, Head, Department of Agriculture, IIAST with operational guidance from Dr. Zeeshan Ahmed Khan and Dr. Pankaj Kumar Gupta, Assistant Professors, Department of Agriculture, IIAST, along with supporting staff Mr. Faisal Kirmani and Mr. Suraj Awasthi. The farmers expressed their appreciation for the services provided and emphasized the need for organizing such camps on a regular basis. They also

suggested inclusion of additional services such as vaccination and advanced veterinary care in future programmes.
