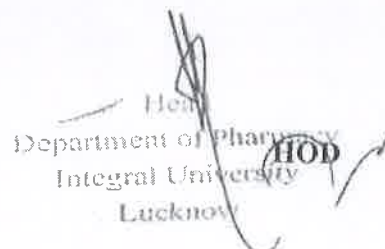

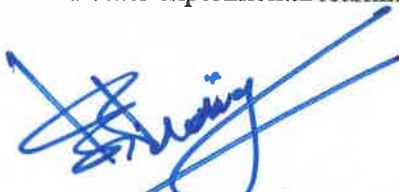
The Student's responses to the proposed changes in the curriculum against different parameters were analysed. Based on their feedback the following points were captured.

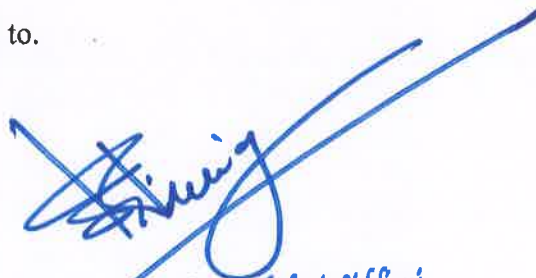
The Teacher's response to the proposed changes in the curriculum against different were recorded and analysed. Based on their feedback the following points were captured.

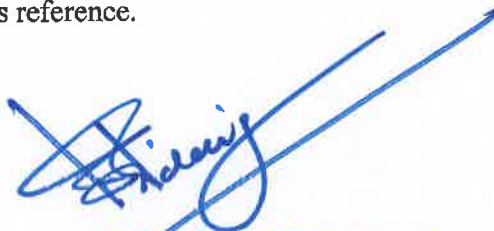
The Employer' responses to different parameters were recorded and analysed. Based on their feedback the following points were captured.

Action Taken Report

(A detailed report on Feedback Analysis and Action Plan was prepared and submitted by the DQAC members in the office of the Head of the Department...Pharmacy. The MoM of the Feedback Analysis is also attached.)

A meeting of the departmental DQAC members was held on 11-2-20. In this meeting the feedback analysis report submitted on 11-2-20 was discussed. After intense deliberations, the DQAC made the following recommendations as the Action Taken Report which was submitted to the BOS committee for further decision on revision and or addition of proposed syllabi. The following proposals were made in the meeting.

Addition of one more Specialization i.e. Pharmacy Practice in Ph. D has been suggested. Course work will be same as that of Pharmacology. The members discussed the proposed changes. The members discussed and approved the same & forwarded to Board of studies for further process. It was also suggested that the new specialization should be introduced and implemented in the current academic session 2020-21.

A suggestion for increase in Introduction of Dual Degree program (B.Pharm/MBA) with sanctioned approved intake of about 100 seats in collaboration with faculty of commerce and Management. The members discussed and approved the same for placing in academic council. The other elective courses which the department already introduced as per PCI guidelines, were also reviewed.

Further a value-added course based on Medical & Pharmaceutical Terminology was pondered upon and suggested for implementation.

Departmental internship program proposed for the students (except those who join internship in external organization) in this session has been discussed.

The DQAC activity calendar was planned for the session 2020-21 and the following activities were organized in the department of Pharmacy.
